#### **Call to Order**

The meeting was called to order at 1:30 p.m. The meeting was recessed at 1:30 p.m. The meeting was reconvened at 2:03 p.m.

Ms. Lambert invited Coach Don Newman and his team members to the podium while she read the recognition. Each team member gave his name, position and the number of years he has been on the team.

### 3. Reports on Special and Outside Committees

Ms. Patterson reported on the recent South County Area Transportation Board Meeting in the city of SeaTac. She reminded the members that SCAT is a transportation advisory group made up of mayors, city councilmembers and county councilmembers, who meet to discuss issues relating to transportation in South King County. The board discussed the implications of the recently passed legislation regarding regional transportation, which will become a ballot measure for voters in 2007. The board also discussed whether existing transportation agencies, i.e., Sound Transit, King County Metro and the Regional Transportation Investment District, should be consolidated.

Mr. Constantine reported on the March 23rd meeting of Sound Transit. The board heard a report by the Expert Review Panel on Sound Transit's effort to develop a package of proposed improvements to submit to voters. The board was also briefed on the new regional transportation law which was passed by the Legislature. Sound Transit staff will come before the board on April 13 with a revised

work plan for the Sound Transit II Project.
