#### **Call to Order**

The meeting was called to order at 1:56 p.m. The Chair recessed the meeting at 3:32 p.m. The Chair reconvened the meeting at 4:14 p.m. The Chair recessed the meeting at 4:23 p.m. The Chair reconvened the meeting at 4:50 p.m.

Mr. Ferguson led the flag salute and Pledge of Allegiance.

#### 1. Approval of Minutes of June 19, 2006

Mr. Gossett moved to approve the minutes of the June 19, 2006 meeting as presented. Seeing no objection, the Chair so ordered.

#### 2. Special Item

Presentation of a Proclamation Declaring June 26, 2006, as King County Parks Volunteers Day, in Recognition of Their Valuable Service to County Parks and Residents

Ms. Hague joined Mr. Phillips at the podium to present the Proclamation. Mr. Phillips made remarks about King County's park system. Ms. Hague also made comments, noting especially the volunteers' efforts. Mr. Phillips invited Jessie Israel, Program Manager, Department of Natural Resources and Parks, to the podium while he and Ms. Hague read the Proclamation. Ms. Israel thanked the Council.

### 3. Reports on Special and Outside Committees

Ms. Patterson reported on the State and King County Boards of Health Joint Forum held on June 13. The Forum was hosted by King County's Board of Health. The participants discussed prevention efforts, disease tracking and limited funding with the State Board. The participants also heard from constituents who expressed concern about indoor air quality in schools.

Ms. Patterson reported on the June 15 Public Health Operational Master Plan Steering Committee meeting. The committee accepted the funding paper as the final installment of the background white papers on public health. Ms. Patterson indicated that funding is not predictable in King County. The master plan will continue to look at financial issues and make recommendations.

Ms. Patterson briefed the Council on the June 16 Board of Health meeting. The Board was briefed on two of the white papers associated with the operational master plan. All five white papers have been approved by the Steering Committee and will be passed on to the Board of Health for final approval this summer. The Board also had a briefing on drowning and drowning prevention.

Ms. Patterson reported on the Metro Transit Facilities Tour which was led by Metro's General Manager, Kevin Desmond and Deputy General Manager, Jim Jacobson. The tour covered bus bases, bus park and rides and Metro's communications center and maintenance bases.

Mr. Phillips reported on the Central Link Oversight Committee, the sub-committee of Sound Transit, which oversees the construction of light rail through Seattle and South King County. The committee had a very detailed project update.

Mr. Phillips reported on the Sound Transit meeting of June 22nd. The members discussed Phase II and what should be included in this next phase of transit investments for voter approval in 2007. Mr. Phillips indicated staff has laid out five scenarios; the Board approved three and will take final action on July 13.

Mr. Phillips briefed the Council on WRIA 8 Steering Committee. The committee discussed the future for committee structure and implementation of projects necessary for salmon recovery.

Mr. Constantine reported on the Prosperity Partnership Eastern Washington Tour. The Partnership includes 150 government, business and labor community organizations in the four counties that participate in the Puget Sound Regional Council, King, Pierce, Snohomish and Kitsap. The members toured eastern Washington, exploring economic development activity. The Partnership's goal is the long term economic health of our region and to create new jobs.

Ms. Hague introduced two newly hired employees, Jennifer Giambattista, assigned to the Labor, Operations and Technology Committee and Simon Farretta, Community Outreach and Events Planner. Ms. Giambattista and Mr. Farretta made comments.
