Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 1:47 p.m.

Mr. Phillips invited Tracy Carroll, Executive Director of NetGreen and Co-founder of Flex Car, and guests to join him as he read the recognition. Mr. Carroll, spoke and thanked the Council. Vic Opperman, Sustainable Ballard Co-founder and President, spoke.

3. <u>Reports on Special and Outside Committees</u>

Ms. Hague briefed the Council on the Public Health operational master plan Steering Committee. The steering committee accepted the policy framework and the Operational Master Plan is going out for stakeholder review. Ms. Hague encouraged members to review the draft framework online.

Ms. Hague reported on the Eastside Transportation Partnership meeting. The Partnership convened a business meeting with a presentation from Washington State Department of Transportation and dealt with a group response on tolling policies. Other presentations from WA DOT included the 520 corridor update; a briefing on the east link scoping for Sound Transit Phase 2 and a discussion of mitigation approach and effectiveness for major corridor construction. Ms. Hague mentioned that she presented the regional members with a briefing on the final Transit Now package.

Mr. Phillips reported on a recent annual Unincorporated Affairs Council meeting. He noted the

attendance of Councilmembers Dunn and Constantine as well as County Executive Ron Sims. The successful meeting produced a big turnout by area citizens and department/division managers where the discussion centered around annexations and incorporations.

Mr. Phillips introduced a new face to the members, *Mr.* Paul Wickenden from Kent County Council, England. *Mr.* Wickenden is the Overview and Scrutiny Manager for the Council. As part of an exchange program, *Mr.* Wickenden will be observing and meeting with Councilmembers and central staff for the next two weeks. *Mr.* Wickenden will also appear before the September 18th Committee of the Whole to give a presentation on Pandemic Flu planning taking place in the U.K.
