Mr. Phillips briefed the Council on the Regional Transit Task Force indicating the Task Force is hard at work learning as much as it can about the Metro system and its challenges. The Task Force had an extensive briefing with background information about the system. There will be a meeting next month regarding what might be done to return service.

Ms. Patterson reported on the Sound Transit Board. The Board adopted a new fare policy for Sound Transit, bus and link light rail. The new policy provides Sound Transit with very clear guidance on the fare structure. The Board also adopted a preferred alignment for east link light rail. The preferred alternative was modified to include a shorter and lower cost tunnel option through downtown Bellevue. East link construction is scheduled to start in late 2013 or early 2014.

Ms. Drago added comments indicating it was a huge milestone for Sound Transit and Bellevue.

Mr. Phillips also added comments, indicating that a number of people worked hard on this issue for some time.
