A MOTION appointing committees to write the voters' pamphlet statements for and against the charter amendment placed on the ballot by Ordinance 16221 for the November 4, 2008, election.

WHEREAS, K.C.C. chapter 1.10 provides for the publication and distribution of local voters' pamphlets in conformity with the provisions of RCW chapter 29A.32 for annual general elections held in King County, and

WHEREAS, RCW 29A.32.280 provides that for each measure from a unit of local government that is included in a local voters' pamphlet, the legislative authority of that jurisdiction shall formally appoint a committee to prepare arguments advocating voter approval of the measure and a committee to prepare arguments advocating voter rejection of the measure, and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 16221, passed by the council on July 28, 2008, provided for submission to the voters at the November 4, 2008, general election, of a proposed new Section 800.20 to be added to the King County Charter;
