AN ORDINANCE relating to the regional stormwater decant plan, revising fees

to be charged by the road service division; and amending Ordinance 13019,

Section 1 (part), and K.C.C. 14.85.020.

## BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. A. Section 2 of this ordinance proposes changes in the fees assessed for the use of county -operated regional stormwater decant facilities.

B. These fees are assessed pursuant to K.C.C. 2.99.030.

SECTION 2. Ordinance 13019, Section 1 (part), and K.C.C. 14.85.020 are each hereby amended to

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read as follows:

Fees. Disposal fees for the use of county\_operated ((vactor waste disposal))

regional stormwater decant facilities shall be ((\$46)) eighty-one dollars per entry for liquids and ((\$43)) fifty-nine dollars per ton for solid vactor waste material.
