BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Ordinance 15652, Section 73, as amended, is hereby amended as follows:

SURFACE WATER MANAGEMENT LOCAL DRAINAGE SERVICES - From the surface water

management local drainage services fund there is hereby appropriated to:
