AN ORDINANCE relating to conversion of time in confinement; and adding a new chapter to K.C.C. Title 5.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

<u>SECTION 1.</u> Section 2 of this ordinance should constitute a new chapter in K.C.C. Title 5.

NEW SECTION. SECTION 2.

A. The community corrections division of the department of adult and juvenile detention shall provide a county supervised community option for offenders convicted of nonviolent and non-sex offenses with sentences of one year or less as provided in RCW 9.94A.680.

B. For the purposes of this section, "county supervised community option" means an alternative to confinement program in which an offender must participate for a minimum of six hours per day of structured

programs offered through, or approved by, the community corrections division. The structured programs may include, but are not limited to: life management skills development; substance abuse assessment and treatment services; mental health assessment and treatment services; counseling; basic adult education and related services; vocational training services; and job placement services.
