WHEREAS, the duly appointed manager of treasury operations of King County, Washington has made an affidavit, Attachment A to this motion, in accordance with RCW 84.56.240 and 84.56.260, to the King County council relating his diligent search and inquiry for goods and chattels of the persons appearing on the list of delinquent taxpayers, Attachment B to this motion, and his inability to find any such property from which the taxes could be collected, and

WHEREAS, the duly appointed manager of treasury operations of King County, Washington, has requested the authority from the King County council to cancel the taxes;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The manager of treasury operations of King County is hereby authorized to cancel the tax billings listed in Attachment B to this motion in the amount of \$125,458.78 from the records of treasury operations for the years 1994, and 1996 through 2001, but the obligation to King County is not forgiven.
