AN ORDINANCE relating to the tax advisor; and amending Ordinance 473,

Section 8, as amended, and K.C.C. 2.52.080.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Ordinance 473, Section 8, as amended, and K.C.C. 2.52.080 are each hereby amended as follows:

A. ((The director shall with concurrence of the council, appoint a tax advisor. The tax advisor shall not be included in the classified civil or career service of the county.)) The director shall serve as property tax advisor for King County in accordance with RCW 84.48.140.

B. The director may with concurrence of the council select, appoint((5)) and compensate, within the amount available or budgeted by appropriation, such other assistants and employees as ((he may)) the director deems necessary to discharge his or her responsibilities under this chapter. ((Such)) The assistants and

employees shall not be included in the classified civil or career service of the county.

C. The director may delegate to other members of his <u>or her</u> staff any of his <u>or her</u> authority or duties under this chapter except this power of delegation and the duty formally to make recommendations to administrative agencies or reports to <u>either or both</u> the ((King County)) executive and((/or)) the ((county)) council.
