WHEREAS, the 2019-2020 Biennial Budget, Ordinance 18835, Section 19, Proviso P5, requires the

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executive to transmit a report on parity between the prosecuting attorney's office and the department of public defense, and

WHEREAS, the report includes the following:

- 1. A definition of "parity," which includes caseloads;
- 2. A review of the extent to which there is parity in the staffing and budgets between the prosecuting attorney's office and the department of public defense; and
- 3. An examination of staffing levels for each court and provides budget options for achieving parity between the two agencies, and

WHEREAS, the executive is further required to submit a motion that acknowledges receipt of the report by July 8, 2019;
