A MOTION adopting the King County 2013 State Legislative Agenda and the
King County 2013 Statement of State Policy.

WHEREAS, the King County council and the King County executive have worked together through their respective government relations staff and desire to bring their positions on issues facing the 2013 Washington State Legislature to the attention of the Washington State Legislature, and

WHEREAS, King County desires to work cooperatively with other local governments and other organizations such as the Washington State Association of Counties, the Washington Association of County Officials, the Sound Cities Association, and the Association of Washington Cities to achieve its 2013 legislative goals, and

WHEREAS, counties have been recognized by the Legislature as partners with the State in the delivery of such critical services as transportation, criminal justice, public health, community and human services, and

water resources, and

WHEREAS, King County is dependent on a strong fiscal partnership with the State, and

WHEREAS, King County has a limited number of revenue sources available to mitigate impacts of budget reductions at the state level, and

WHEREAS, the slow recovery from the Great Recession combined with structural limitations on county funding sources means that revenue growth does not keep up with the rate of inflation, and

WHEREAS, King County's ability to deliver health care, human services, criminal justice, and other basic services is directly impacted by reductions in the state budget, and

WHEREAS, the state's across-the-board reductions have already affected key functions of county departments and agencies, and

WHEREAS, King County is dedicated to exploring with the State new ideas for sustained funding for critical services such as transportation, criminal justice, and health and human services, and

WHEREAS, the King County council and the King County executive will continue to review legislative developments for possible revisions of King County's 2013 state legislative program;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The King County council hereby adopts the attached King County 2013 State Legislative Agenda and King County 2013 Statement of State Policy as King County's highest priorities for action in the 2013 legislative session of the Washington State Legislature.
