AN ORDINANCE authorizing the county executive to execute a contract agreement between King County and Highline school district for school resource officer law enforcement services.

STATEMENT OF FACTS:

1. Highline school district desires to provide school resource officer services in schools within its jurisdiction. For the 2013-2014 school year, the school district has requested forty thousand dollars in hourly school resource officer services to be provided.
2. The county has the ability to provide these school resource officer services.
3. Participation in the agreement is to the benefit of the citizens of King County.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. The county executive is hereby authorized to execute a contract agreement with Highline school district, in substantially the form of Attachment A to this ordinance.
