WHEREAS, on April 16, 2009, the King County Board of Health adopted operating rules for the board

through BOH R&R 09-04, and

WHEREAS, the adopted operating rules state that the board shall designate annually four vice-chairs,

each representing one of the major categories of membership, and

WHEREAS, the adopted operating rules state that, in the absence of the chair, a vice-chair will exercise

the duties, powers and prerogatives of the chair, and

WHEREAS, the adopted operating rules state that each year the board shall designate by resolution the

order in which the vice-chairs may act in absence of the chair, and

WHEREAS, the adopted operating rules state that the order of the vice-chairs shall rotate annually;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF HEALTH OF KING COUNTY:

For 2019, the board designates the following order in which the vice-chairs may act in absence of the
